

## RESERVED EASEMENTS

- EIN 55** Existing winter access trail from Pike Bay on Lake Aleknagik northerly to public lands and waters (25 foot trail, limited to winter use).
- EIN 8** Existing access trail from Fenno Creek on the south shore of River Bay on Lake Nerka southerly to public lands (25 foot trail).
- EIN 8a** One (1) acre site east of the mouth of Fenno Creek on the south shore of River Bay on Lake Nerka.
- EIN 52a** Proposed access trail three (3) miles northwest of Happy Creek on the north shore of Lake Aleknagik northeasterly to public lands (25 foot trail limited to winter use).

**DILLINGHAM B-8** *Reserved Easements continued*

- EIN 53** Winter access trail one-half (1/2) mile southeast of Happy Creek on the north shore of Lake Aleknagik easterly to public lands (25 foot trail limited to winter use).
- EIN 54** One (1) acre site on Bear Bay on the south shore of Lake Aleknagik.
- EIN 54a** Proposed access trail from Bear Bay westerly to public lands (25 foot trail).
- EIN 24** A road from FAS 411 westerly to Lake Aleknagik in 10S 56 W (60 foot road).
- EIN 51** One (1) acre site on the west shore of Lake Aleknagik three (3) miles southeast of Nunvuk Mountains.
- EIN 43** Proposed access trail from Lake Aleknagik southerly to Icy Creek and public lands (25 foot trail).
- FAS 411** Omnibus Road. Dillingham to Wood River Spur 200 foot right-of-way, 100 foot right-of-way on to Aleknagik. AN CAB VSL 78-28. EIN 9.
- EIN 50** Winter access trail from Lake Aleknagik northerly to public lands (25 foot trail limited to winter use).
- EIN 52** One (1) acre site three (3) miles northwest of Happy Creek on the north shore of Lake Aleknagik.
