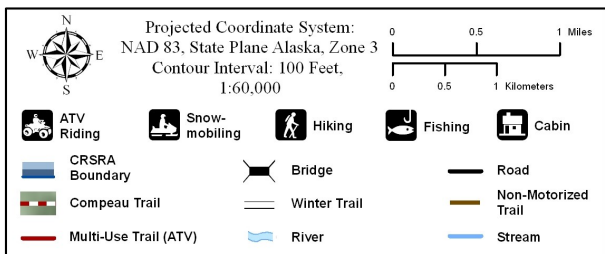
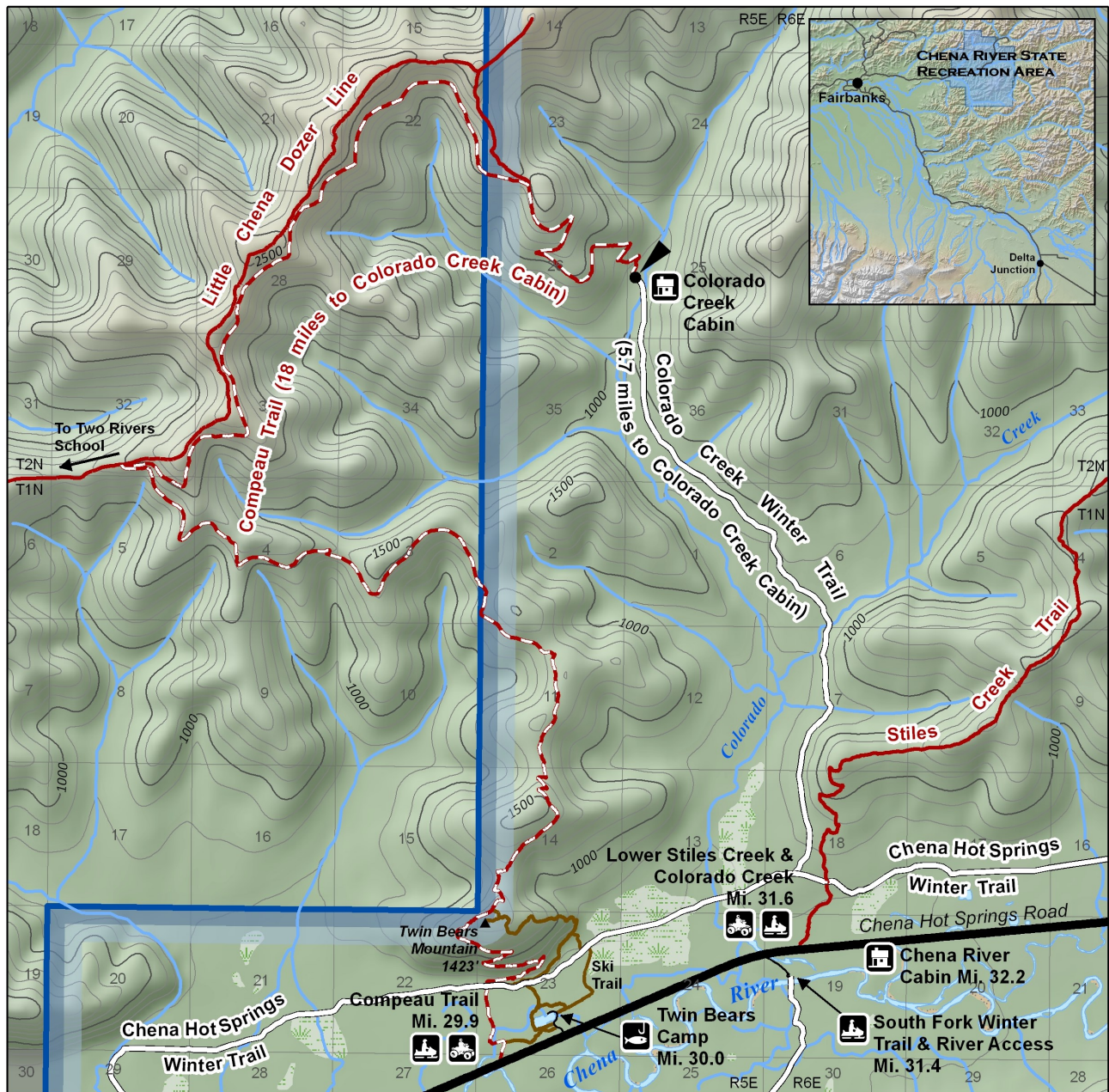


Colorado Creek Public Use Cabin

The Colorado Creek Cabin can be reached by the Colorado Creek Winter Trail and the Compeau Trail.

Colorado Creek Winter Trail: Summer use is prohibited due to boggy soils. This multi-use trail is open to snowmobile, skiing, mushing and snowshoe. A loading ramp is available at the trailhead located at mile 31.6 Chena Hot Spring Road. Follow the BLUE trail markers 5.7 miles to the cabin. You will cross Colorado Creek's main channel at mile 2.5. Watch for the turnoff to the cabin at mile 5.4. The cabin is another 0.3 miles from the turnoff.

Compeau Trail: This multi-use trail is open to ATVs, hiking, biking, horseback riding, snowmobile, snowshoe, and skiing. It provides good summer access to the Colorado Creek Public Use Cabin. The Compeau trailhead is located at mile 29.9 Chena Hot Springs Road, on the north side of the road. Follow the blue/black trail markers 18 miles to the cabin. The Compeau Trail makes a turn at mile 10; just past this turn the trail intersects the Little Chena Dozer Line. You can also get to the cabin following the dozer line. After riding 5.5 more miles, the trail intersects a 1950's dozer line; a sign marks this intersection. Follow the steep grade 3/4's of a mile downhill before connecting with the Compeau Trail again. The last 2 miles gradually descend to the cabin.
