SANDG OUR PAST: PLANNING FOR OUR FUTURE UPDATING ALASKA'S HISTORIC PRESERVATION PLAN




- Every five years the Office of History and Archaeology, as the SHPO, facilitates the preparation of a statewide historic preservation plan that:
 - encourage broad public participation in planning for cultural resources,
 - meet challenges unique to each state,
 - influence historic preservation policy in state and local governments,
 - and empower local communities, organizations, and individuals to action.
- Saving our Past: Alaska Historic Preservation Plan will expire the end of 2017
- OHA is beginning our public outreach in the development of a new historic preservation plan for Alaska to guide us from 2018-2023.



PRESERVATION PLANNING IN ALASKA

- First statewide plan was written in 1970
- Work on a substantive revision of the plan began in the mid 1980s
- Saving Our Past written and adopted in 1995



SAVING OUR PAST 2011-2017

The 3rd edition of Saving Our Past is intended to guide preservation activities through 2017.

It identifies three principal needs for historic preservation in Alaska:

- Need for a statewide agenda
- Need for greater public awareness and understanding of historic preservation
- Need to make connections between economics and historic preservation

The plan establishes six goals to meet these needs.



SAVING OUR PAST 2011-2017

GOAL 1: Foster respect and understanding for Alaska's archaeological and historic resources and promote a preservation ethic.

GOAL 2: Continue existing partnerships and seek new ones to expand and strengthen the historic preservation community.

GOAL 3: Expand efforts to identify, study, designate, interpret, and protect or treat significant archaeological and historic resources.



SAVING OUR PAST 2011-2017

GOAL 4: Encourage consideration of archaeological and historic resources in the planning and decision making process of the public and private sectors.

GOAL 5: Promote historic preservation as an economic development tool and provide incentives to encourage it.

GOAL 6: Encourage appropriate treatment of historic resources.

Establish goals, objectives, strategies
Provide draft plan for review by early May

Finalize Plan Summer-Fall 2017

Incorporate final comments
Submit final draft to NPS by September 30, 2017
2017 begin implementing plan, monitoring yearly


