Considerations for Denali State Park Trail Management Plan Proposals

Trail proposal

Develop draft Trail Management Objective (TMO) (see plan website for TMO form)



Is the trail compatible with:

- Statutes (ennabling legislation and statutes related to management of state park areas)
- Regulations
- Park Mission Statement
- Plans and policies, such as:
 - Denali State Park Management Plan (2006)
 - Division of Parks & Outdoor Recreation Ten-Year Strategic Plan 2007-2017
 - o Division of Parks & Outdoor Recreation Trail Management Policy (March 2009)
 - South Denali Visitor Center Complex Interpretive Master Plan (August 2009)
 - Alaska Recreational Trails Plan (October 2000)



Who owns or manages the land that the proposed trail would be constructed on?



What are the impacts to:

- Biological resources: vegetation, fish and wildlife (including habitat and corridors)
- Physical resources: soil and water
- Cultural resources: historical and archaeological



Can the trail be built to last?

- Does the trail conform to its terrain and environment; is it capable of handling its intended use without serious degradation; and does it require minimal maintenance (Sustainable design framework). To answer these questions, evaluate the following:
 - O Physical conditions: soils, side slope, aspect, elevation and hydrology
 - Weather: seasonal variations, precipitation timing, volume and intensity
 - O How the trail will be used:
 - type and season of use
 - volume and intensity of use
 - desired experience of trail users



Does the trail fill a local, regional or statewide need?

- What trail opportunities & related experiences are available in the park, in areas adjoining the park, in the region and statewide?
- Is there support for this trail?
- What are the local, statewide and national recreation trends?
 That is, "If we build it will they come?"
